The Jamboree Leadership Team (JLT) had its first face-to-face meeting of 2019 ("delivery year") on 24 February 2019 in Wellington.

Jamboree Targets

The Jamboree Leadership Team has begun working with targets to deliver a successful Jamboree. The Team had an initial discussion about progress against the following targets

Directorate	Targets
Infrastructure Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ A sound and well-implemented risk management system, including training for all participants➤ Facilities, particularly toilets and showers with separation for Scouts/Adults and genders, are in place➤ Deliver sufficient food and quality catering
Business Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Sufficient Leaders and Staff are found for the Programmes Branch➤ Jamboree communications encourage participation and showcase Scouting➤ Sound financial management disciplines are maintained throughout the Jamboree
Youth Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Staff for delivering the programme found and managed well, with a high-quality programme consistent with the key SCOUTS New Zealand policies➤ Youth and adult welfare system is put in place➤ An Operations Management system (including incident management) is put in place to ensure that Scouts and Adult participants with good and timely answers to their questions.

Jamboree Management Team Meeting: 30 and 31 March 2019

The Jamboree Management Team meeting at the end of March will focus on:

- Engagement with the Jamboree Patrol that continues with the youth partnership we have established.
- Updating the context for Jamboree organisation, including expectations from the National Executive Committee, developments in implementing the Better Prepared Strategy (including the Youth Development Policy) and learning from other major events SCOUTS New Zealand have delivered (the last Venture) or been involved with (AJ2019).
- Progress updates from key Jamboree Branches, particularly facilities, programme, risk and operations.
- A second round of "Speed dating" between branches, including discussion of delivery milestones that contribute to other branches. For this purpose, it is important that each Branch considers and updates their milestones for successful delivery of the Jamboree.

Other matters

Other matters discussed were:

- Delegations for the operation of the Jamboree. This includes financial and other delegations which are similar to those put in place for the last Venture.
- Updating the Development Sub-Committee of the Board (i.e. the National Executive Committee of SCOUTS New Zealand). The focus for these updates is programme, risk (including child protection) and financial management.
- Encouragement for Directors to have ongoing Directorate ZOOM video conference and face-to-face meetings this year, in addition to the Jamboree Management Team meetings.
- The need for Branch managers and their teams to consider and act on offers of service from adults that are coming through the Registrations and Staffing Branch. This includes advising the Registrations and Staffing Branch team of the action that has been taken.
