Scouts Will Do The Grocery Shopping!

During Jamboree, your team will have a "duty day" instead of doing programmed activities.

One of the key responsibilities of the duty patrol is grocery shopping and cooking the meals for the troop. The team will be given a shopping list and a time to visit the catering department. They will take their trolley down to collect the groceries needed for the next 24hours and visit the cooking base to learn how to cook dinner.

Jamboree Event Badges - Guidelines

At past Jamborees, issues have arisen with fairness of badge swapping and with copyright which puts SCOUTS New Zealand at significant risk. There are also some concerns about the role of adults in badge collecting and swapping, often to the disadvantage of Scouts. This runs contrary to the 22nd New Zealand Scout Jamboree objectives as a Jamboree "for Scouts, by Scouts".

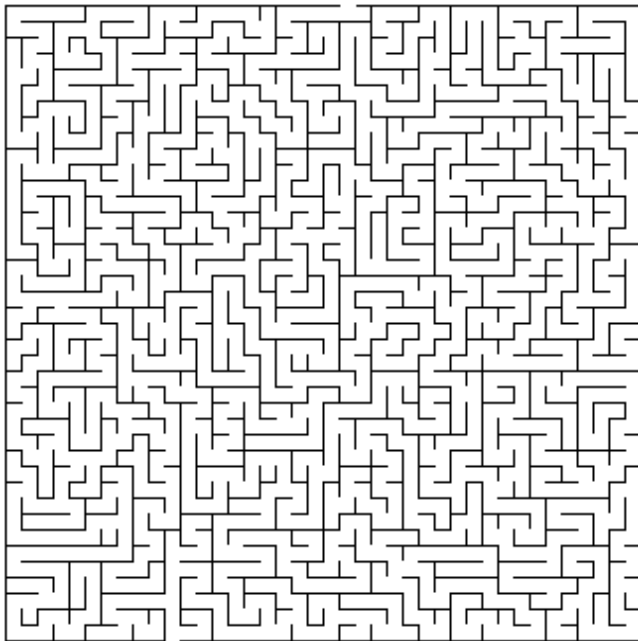
We've put together a Badge Guidelines document which is available for everyone to read before coming to Jamboree. The guidelines can be found on the downloads page of the [website here](#).
