Gateways, Flagpoles and Structures

Troops are encouraged to be as creative as possible on their sites. All structures, including gateways and flagpoles, must be well constructed to minimise risk of injury to persons passing through or near the structures.

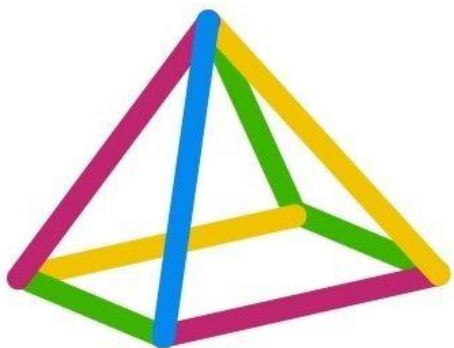
All troop sites will need to have a front entrance with their site identification number and their Jamboree troop name clearly visible. You will also need to allow room on or near your entrance to display Camping Standard pennants.

The maximum height of troop gateways is 2.4 metres, with a minimum of 1.5 metres clearance on both sides from the site boundary. The gateway can be on the front boundary line but no support or guy lines are allowed into the roadway in front of that line.

The maximum height of the troop flagpole is 5 metres.
