Troops Arrival At Jamboree

The excitement will begin as you travel to the Jamboree site in full uniform. It's very important to remember that there is no hurry to arrive at Mystery Creek. The site will be open for entry for all participants from 8am on Saturday 28 December. NO site access will be available before 8am – there will be no exceptions.

Troops will be welcomed on their buses, individually walked to their site, given welcome packs and ID cards (to be worn at all times). Entry will be delayed if you need to complete any incomplete prerequisite paperwork so it's better to arrive well prepared! Troop Support and the Jamboree Hub will help resolve any discrepancies.

If you are traveling in individual vehicles you will need to meet at a predetermined location before Mystery Creek so that the Scouts and Adult Leaders arrive at the Jamboree site at the same time and can be welcomed as one troop.

Once your troop site has been set up consider supporting troops that arrive later in the day. A welcome smile and offer of help will go a long way to ensuring mutual support during your Jamboree. There are no planned activities until 1.30pm on Sunday 29 December (the Opening Ceremony).
