This means catering for more than 4000 people made up of 3443 Scouts and Leaders in contingents, plus over 600 staff which is no small task! Chris and his team have catered for a number of Jamborees in the past and he assures me “You will not go hungry.”

They have ordered for the Jamboree 3846 bottles of milk, 1772 tins of fruit salad, and for dinner last night 1180 six packs of burger buns. Chris says “Catering always
