Special challenges: the 6 am trip to Stokes Valley before leaving for Jamboree (which was NOT fun) and sorting out apparel.

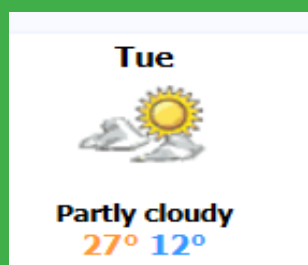
Achievements: One Scout has attended Aviation School.

They have three badges: one for the Kapiti Coastal Zone (Levin) Scouts, one for the Lower Hutt Zone Scouts and one for the combined troop.



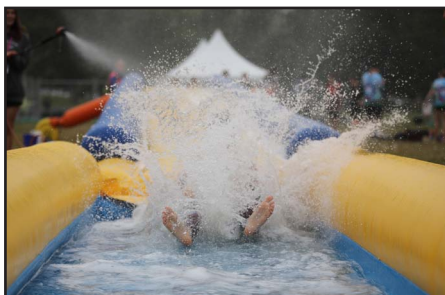

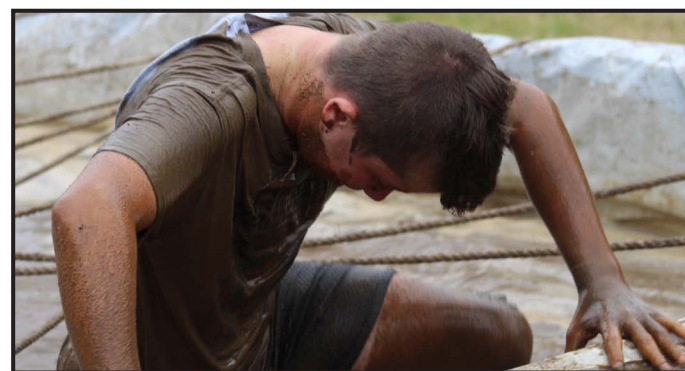
## SPOTLIGHT - LAND OF THE LOST SCOUT (CHALLENGE VALLEY)

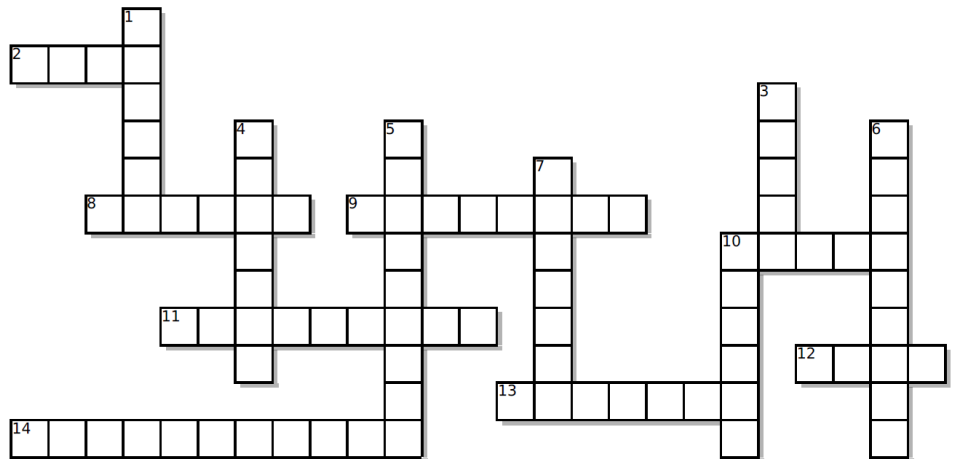
