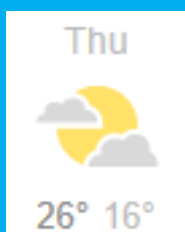
NEW YEARS CELEBRATIONS

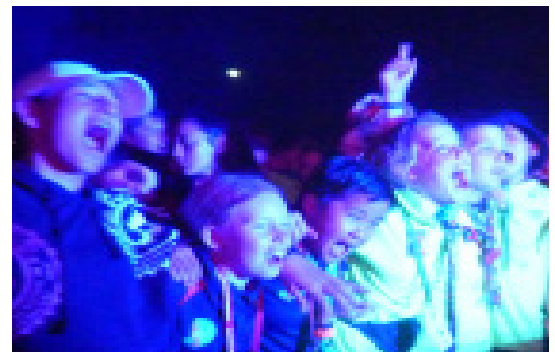

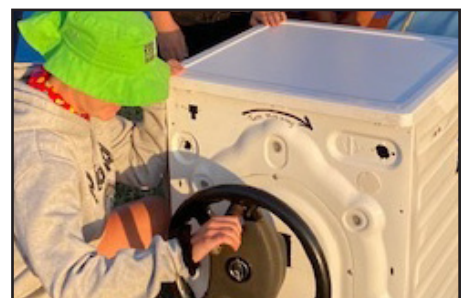
CHIEF SCOUT PRESENTATION AT 7AM THIS MORNING!

Flag Facts:

Flags are usually raised in the morning and lowered at night. However, A flag may be flown on a 24-hour basis especially when buildings are floodlit.

Flags must never be flown in a worn/damaged condition.

Flags must not touch the ground.

Flags must not be raised upside-down except in times of extreme distress/danger.

The study of flags is called vexillology.
