

CREATION STATION

Craft it up on Home base at the Creation Station! On this base you will get to paint rocks, make wooden and metal woggles and spray paint a t-shirt.

The patrol from "Pigs on Pops" that I caught up with gave me a few helpful tips on how to get some great masterpieces. To get a stunning woggle they said you should "go slow [while using] the scroll saw," and when spray painting a snazzy t-shirt they reckoned it's better to use a few colours so they stand out, rather than having lots all blend together.

A patrol from Wellington Vortex troop recommended using a big flat rock and multiple coats of paint when doing rock painting to make sure your work of art is nice and bright. Regardless of what you create you'll walk out of the base with an extremely personalised memento for a once in a scout time experience.

INTERNATIONAL BADGES

Hi Matilda, what is badging like in Australia? Badging is pretty much like what we see here in NZ, at home everyone tries to get the State badges and pretty much only Australian badges. We see more International badges here.

We also spoken with our International Team about what they see.

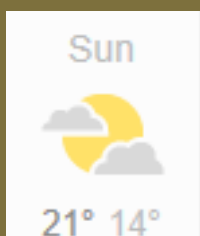
The essence of scout badges is one of the common threads or linkages with heritage and identification in scouting.

Badges are an expression of who you are as much as Scarfs can be seen as an extension of this. Tahitian Scarves have a similar feeling to New Zealand Scarfs. New Caledonian and Tahitian badges have visible links back to French Scouting

We have 598 Scouts from 17 International Countries at NZ22 jamboree



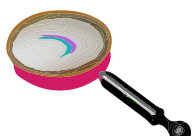
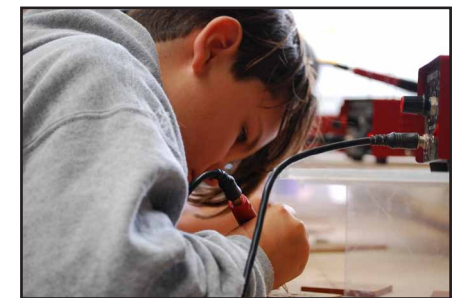

First aid support is a critical resource for Jamboree. At Jamboree we have seven staff St John's working onsite in shifts and an additional two staff out at Karapiro during the day. A large portion of these staff are ex-Scouts and they are all working for free over the 11 days of Jamboree, to help take care of everyone onsite.

They try to do as much as possible on site, but if someone needs further assessment for things like x-rays, they will send them off site to the appropriate place. They tell us that they are really enjoying getting to see all of the Scouts, having fun on all of the activities. To help keep healthy over Jamboree they highly recommend that you make sure to drink lots of water (3 - 4L) as you are out in

the blistering heat sweating from running around doing activities, wearing lots and lots of sunscreen, and if you're unsure about any injuries or symptoms you have pop in and visit them. Do your best to stay safe out there everyone!



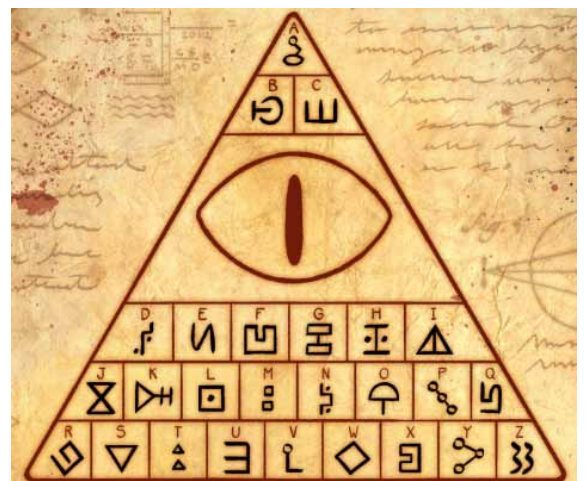
BIRTHDAYS AT JAMBOREE
