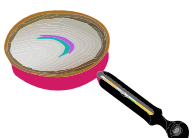

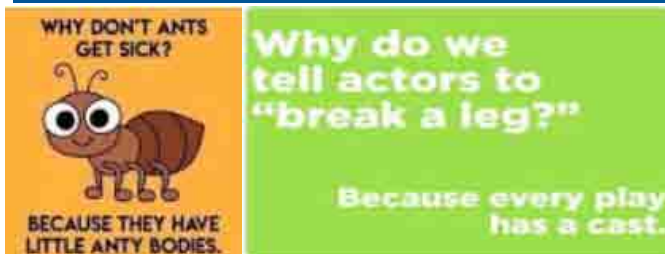

The new centre board is lighter but stronger and these cutters are apparently way more comfortable to sit in.

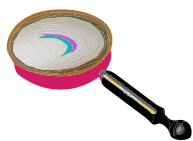
The Scouts said having the opportunity to meet all these other Scouts is awesome.
